

Cloud Forests


- Names: "Montane rainforests" or the "Elfin Woodland"
- Characteristics
 - Forest engrossed by thick clouds and mist
 - Nearly-Constant
 - Tropical Climate
 - Very wet
 - No dry season
 - Mountains




Formation

- Unique Conditions
 - Elevation between 3,000-10,000 ft
 - Temperature drops
 - Water
 - Condensation
 - High levels
 - Trapped within biomass
 - Put into soil
 - Air currents Has prevailing winds

Formation cont. - Topography and Precipitation in N. Costa Rica









 - Single story
 - Cedro trees
 - 35-45 m (about 0.02 miles) tall
- Ferns
- Flowering plants

- Epiphytes
 - o "Air plants"
 - Orchids
 - Lichen
 - Mosses
 - Bromeliads



Andean Bear

- Diet
 - o Omnivore
- Other names
 - Tremarctos ornatus, or decorated bear
 - Scientific name
 - Spectacled bear



Andean Bear - cont

- AgeCall
 - 35 years old in captivity, but it is unknown in the wild
- Size
 - 6.5 ft (1.98m) length and 31 (71.74 cm) inches tall
 - 220-386 pounds (100-175 kg) males
 - 130-176 pound (59-80 kg) females

Some key facts in this cloud forest

- The reserve was established in 1972
- Its area extends over 35,000 acres (54.69 square miles)
- 8 life zones atop the Continental Divide
- 8 miles (12874.8 m) of walkable trails
- Supports all 6 species of the cat family
 - jaguars, ocelots, pumas, oncillas, margays, and jaguarundis


Yellow square indicates regions of cloud forest in Mexico

Some Key Facts in this Cloud Forest

- Known for its migratory bird populations
- Threat of agricultural development for coffee
- Carbon storage of 128,971 metric tons (128971000 kg)
- About 1,000 acres (1,56 square miles) large



Yakushima Island, Japan's cloud forest




Some Key Facts in this Cloud Forest

- Known as "the island of ancient forest and water" because of the huge Yaku cedars, which are over 1,000 years old, moss and abundant water system.
- Some special species in this area are the red-bottomed macaques and sika deer
- Only reachable via ferry or flight because it is located on an island

Some Key Facts in this Cloud Forest

- Lowest altitude of most cloud forests at 5,000 feet (1524 m) above sea level
 - Warmer and more humid than the average cloud forests
- Home to many indigenous species

Some Key Facts in this Cloud Forest-cont.

- High level of endemicity in this cloud forest
 - 35% plants
 - o 42% fish
 - 48% reptiles
 - o 75% amphibians






Map of the cloud forest in Spain






Singapore's cloud forest map



Map of Singapore's cloud forest location




Some Key Facts in this Cloud Forest

- Conservatory
- Commercialized entrance fee and misting hours
- 2 acres (about 0.003 square miles) large
- Its artificial conditions mock conditions between 1,000 and 3,000 meters (between about 0.62 and 1.86 miles) above sea level
- "Cloud mountain"
 - Special vegetation

Unique Characteristics of the Mindo Cloud Forest

- This area was named the first Important Bird Area in the Americas in 1997
 - Botanical abundance
 - Fauna species
 - Unique flora species
 - Considered to be vital for ecological and responsible tourism development.

Unique Characteristics of the Mindo Cloud Forest-cont.

- The typical temperature in this area ranges from 60 degrees Fahrenheit (15.56 degrees Celsius) to 75 degrees Fahrenheit (23.89 degrees Celsius)
- No dry season, but drier in the months of May to September
- 48,000 acres (75 square miles) large

Expectations at this elevation

- Dress in layers due to the temperature variation
- Wear rain gear
- Bring sunscreen lotion, a hat/cap, good hiking shoes, and an extra pair of socks

 - o Release gases
 - \blacksquare CO₂
 - \blacksquare SO_2
 - Temperature
 - Drop by .5 DegreesCelsius
 - o Ash
 - Can impact rivers

 - Scare wildlife
 - Harm vegetation
 - Reduce vegetation
 with widening of trails

- Infrastructure
 - Habitat destruction to house travellers
 - Increased waste land and water pollution
 - Air pollution with transportation

Dangers to the forest

- Dangers to cloud forests on a global scale

 - Habitat degradation

- Flooding




How is it impacted by Global Climate Change?
